BACKGROUND ON START

In **partnership** with Hunterdon County Prosecutor's Office, and Hunterdon County Chief's Association, Safe Communities Coalition created S.T.A.R.T. (Steps To Action Recovery and Treatment) initiative.

START was first designed as a tool to bridge the treatment gap and prevent overdose, and has since become a symbol of **reliable** resources and information.

ONE VOICE The goal of One Voice is to create social level change in **reducing substance use** through our faith communities.



Annual launch includes a weekend of **shared messaging** into the community, led by faith leaders, with **"one voice"**.

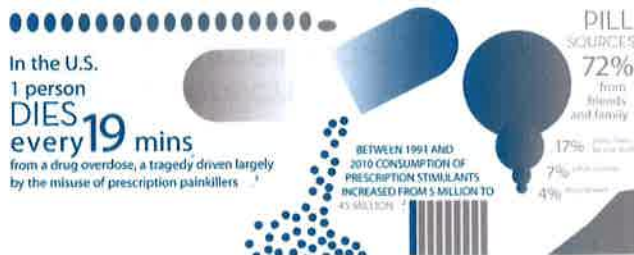

WHAT YOU CAN DO

SAFE Medicine Storage



Use a MedLock Box to store medicines in the home instead of an easily accessible location, like a medicine cabinet.

SAFE Medicine Disposal

Use a medicine drop box near you to safely dispose of any unwanted/expired medicines.

Don't Run Call 911

New Jersey's
Overdose
Prevention Bill
Will Protect you

Passed April 29, 2013

New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie signed a law that encourages people to report drug overdoses without fear of being arrested. Under the law, those who call 911 to report overdoses will be immune from arrest and prosecution for drug possession. The law also applies to the person overdosing.
